BT 100 NEW TESTAMENT OVERVIEW

2 Semester Hours

Bible Times and Biblical Geography

A class designed to help unlock some of the culture, traditions and themes of the New Testament, helping the student to better understand the historical background to New Testament themes as well as being exposed to basic New Testament Biblical Geography.

The Book of Acts

An overview of the book of Acts with an emphasis on the formation of the early church, as well as a look at the missionary activity in the spreading of Christianity during the first century.

BT 101 UNDERSTANDING AND APPLYING THE BIBLE

3 Semester Hours

Development of the Bible (Canon)

A focus on how the Bible was written and preserved and how it developed into our current Canon of Scripture.

Bible Study Methods

A class designed to help the student learn how to correctly study the Bible and find for themselves the great truths it contains. This class will also give some introduction to the art of Biblical observation, interpretation, and application.

10 Commandments

This introductory week will not only give the student an overview of the years activities and expectations, but will also help each student create a solid spiritual foundation based on an in-depth study of the Ten Commandments as a basis of the moral code for living.

BT 102 THEOLOGICAL OVERVIEW (GOD'S PLAN FOR REDEMPTION)

2 Semester Hours

Eschatology

An introduction to the theology of prophecy and events yet to come.

The History of Redemption

A class that traces the Biblical account of how God set forth throughout all Scripture the plan of redemption and how this affects individuals in today's society.

BT 103 THE SYNOPTIC GOSPELS

2 Semester Hours

A two-week module class with a focus on the life, times, culture and person of Christ as revealed in the three Synoptic Gospels.

BT 104 INTRODUCTION TO THE OLD TESTAMENT

2 Semester Hours

Old Testament Survey

A two-week class with an overview of the development and themes found in the Old Testament, addressing questions such as authorship, arrangement and emphasis of each of the Old Testament books.

Kings and Prophets

Studying the kings and prophets of the Old Testament.

BT 105 GENESIS*2 Semester Hours***Book of Genesis**

This class is designed to give an overview of the Book of Genesis with special emphasis given to the earlier chapters of that book and the Biblical account of Creation.

Creationism

The study of the creation account in the Bible.

BT 106 WISDOM LITERATURE*3 Semester Hours*

These classes will give an overview and exposure to the Wisdom Literature of the Old Testament with a primary emphasis on the Book of Ecclesiastes.

Psalms & Proverbs**Ecclesiastes****BT 107 CORINTHIAN EPISTLES***2 Semester Hours***I Corinthians****II Corinthians**

Because of its significance to Christian ethics and a Biblical perspective on the gifts of the Spirit, the students will be given more extensive exposure to this particular Epistle by Paul.

BT 108 WRITINGS OF PETER, JOHN, & JAMES*3 Semester Hours***I,II,III John**

A comprehensive overview of the three books: I, II, and III John.

Hebrews and James

An overview of the books of Hebrews and James.

I and II Peter**BT109 PAULINE EPISTLES***3 Semester Hours***I, II Timothy, I, II Thessalonians, Titus, Philemon**

An overview of Paul's Pastoral Epistles as well as the books of I and II Thessalonians and Philemon.

Romans**Colossians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians****CM 101 CHRISTIANITY IN CONTEMPORARY SOCIETY***3 Semester Hours***Cults and Modern Movements**

A class designed to understand what is "orthodox" and what is considered to be cultic with a basic overview of some of the more major "isms" affecting our society today.

Personal Evangelism

A course designed to help the students learn how to become more comfortable with sharing their faith with unbelievers.

Missions

A brief history of the modern missionary movement coupled with an overview of missions in the world today.

CM 103 SPIRITUAL FORMATION

2 Semester Hours

Personal Devotions and Prayer

A fun and challenging week backpacking in the wilderness, followed by continued study all semester. This class will enable the students to get to know themselves and their fellow class members in an unforgettable encounter with nature and through peer interaction in a setting removed from the disruptions of modern life. The class will continue throughout the remainder of the semester, on campus.

Scripture Basis for Relationships (Exploring Relationships)

This class will help students better understand how to relate to others in a more Christ-like manner.

CM 104 OVERVIEW OF CHURCH HISTORY

2 Semester Hours

Overview of Church History

An introduction to the history of the Church since its' beginning at Pentecost until the current century.

Philosophy of Christianity

A class designed to help the student understand the basic philosophical concepts of the Christian faith and how these concepts apply to today's society.

CM 105 APPLIED CHRISTIANITY

2 Semester Hours

Stewardship

A class designed to help the student learn how to effectively manage his/her time, money, and talents.

The final week of instruction for the year will be a practical class on how to take what has been learned throughout the year and apply it to the student's own life and the life of his/her individual church.
